Prophecy of the Kalki Avatar

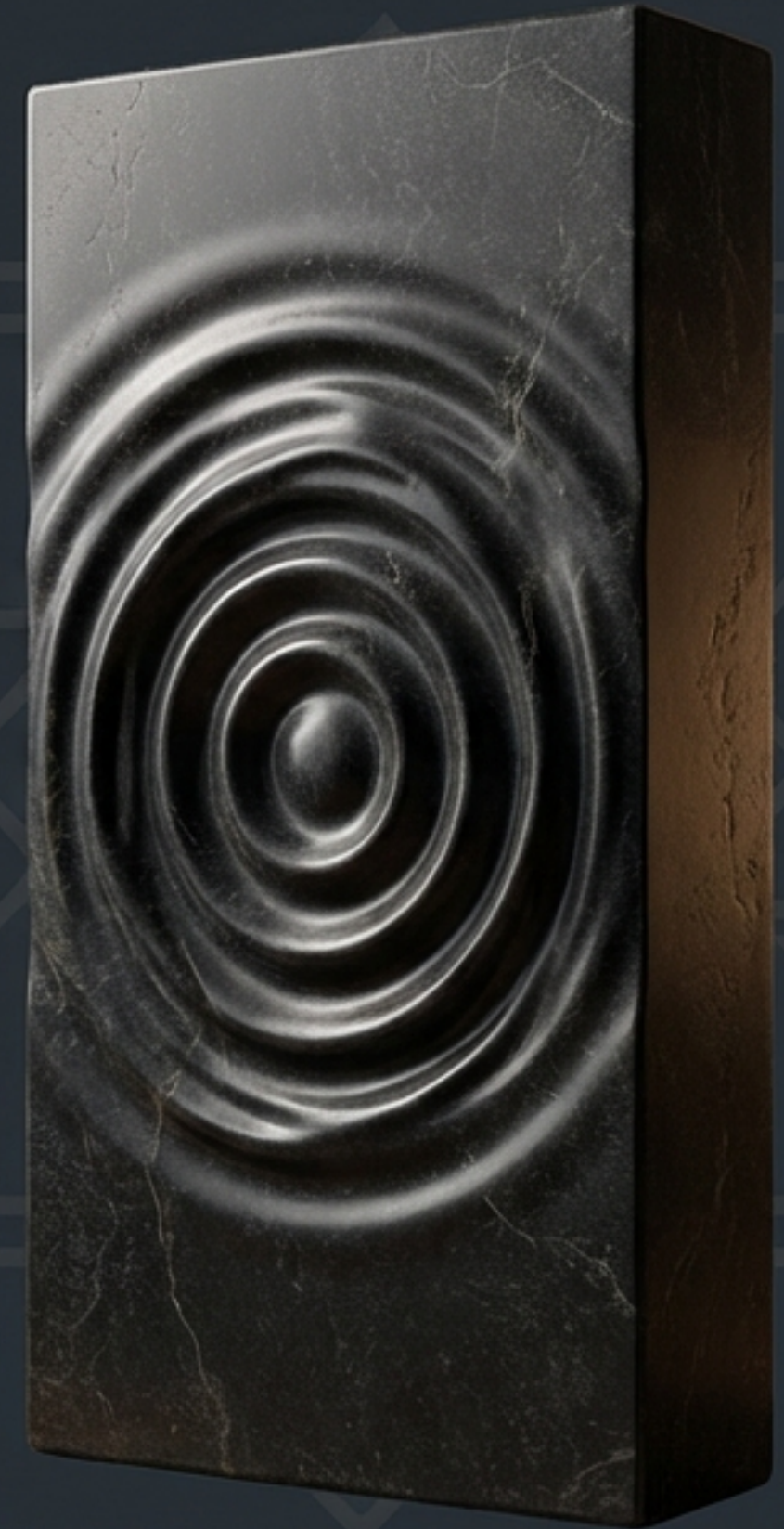
- Will ride a horse and carry a sword to defeat evildoers.
