The Fitrah

Natural disposition is the motive that prompts one to consider the purpose of existence... directing toward belief in the One Creator.

The Premise

Hinduism has undergone immense change. The original Vedas reflect pure monotheism, but modern practices have intertwined with later philosophies, esoteric Tantras, and human additions.

The Vedic Foundation: Pure Monotheism

The Vedas



Quote 1 (Rig Veda): “O Allah, both the sun and the universe cannot encompass or contain you.”

Quote 2 (Yajur Veda): “He is the One before Whom nothing was created, and He is our Creator and our Owner and He knows everything.”

Absolute Monotheism



Takeaway: “The original texts explicitly call for belief in a single God who is separate from, and greater than, His creation.”

The Shift: From One Creator to Pantheism

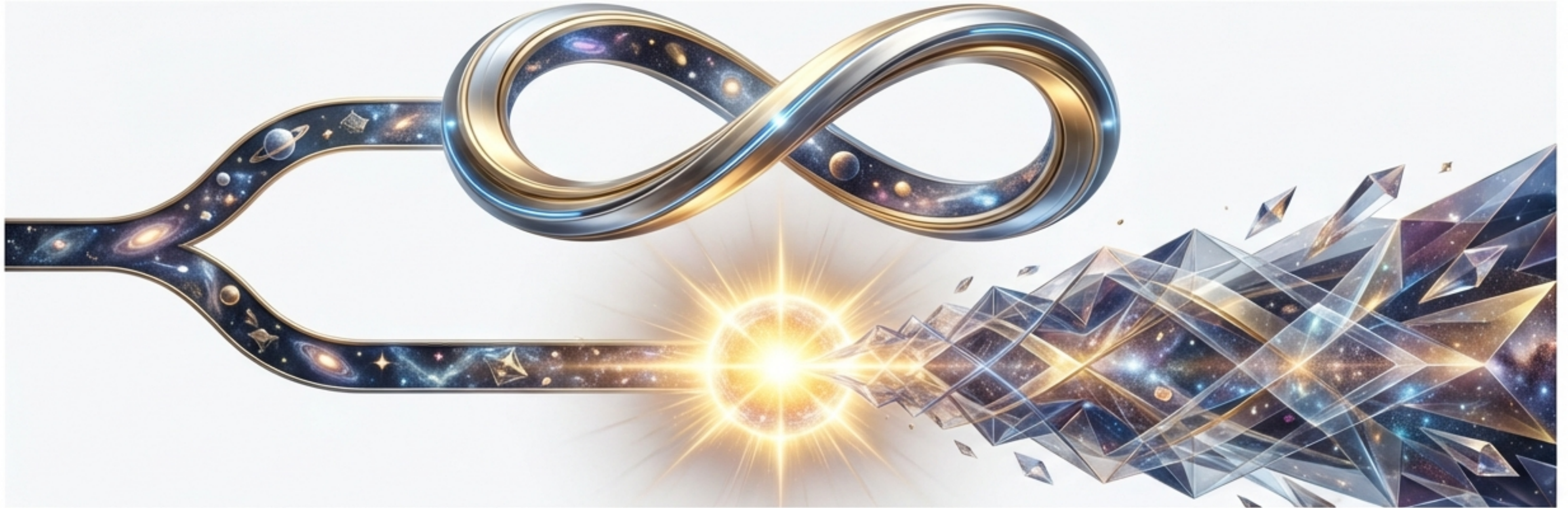
Modern Hinduism (Pantheism) believes the Creator unites with creation (God resides in everything).



Logical Paradox: If the deity resides in everything, how can a person seek to 'reach' Him through rituals when He already exists within them?

Vedic Warning: "He who worships, apart from Allah, manufactured things will drown in the depths of darkness..." (Yajur Veda).

The Universe: Eternal Cycles vs. An Absolute Beginning

The Modern Hindu View

The material universe dissolves and forms in an endless cycle, necessitating that matter is timeless.

The Scientific & Islamic Reality

The universe has an absolute beginning. It was created in an unprecedented manner.

Quranic Alignment

(Surah Al-Baqarah 2:117): "The Originator of the heavens and earth. When He decrees a matter, He only says to it, 'Be,' and it is."

The Cycle of Life: Reincarnation vs. Reason



Logical Flaws

- **Population Growth:** The number of living beings is not fixed; Earth's population has demonstrably grown.
- **Tertullian's Objection:** Why does a newborn lack the mental faculties of the adults they previously were?

Scholar Quote

Shri Styakam Widyalkar states, "The creed of soul transmigration does not exist in the Vedas. I challenge anyone who says so."

Proof in Ritual

Hindus perform 'Śrāddha' to calm the souls of the dead. How could souls migrate if they still reside with the dead?

Karma and Society: The Injustice of Caste

The Social Impact

The philosophy of Karma dictates that people are born into suffering (like the "Untouchables") because of sins in a past life.



The Consequence

This creates a reconciliation with backwardness, class discrimination, and oppression, viewing the suffering of the poor as "deserved punishment."

The Vedic Contrast

The original Vedas speak of Paradise and Hell based on deeds in this life, not a cycle of discriminatory rebirths.

The Alternative to Asceticism: Building the World

The Hindu Ascetic (Moksha)



Escaping to wastelands, abandoning family, and burning the body to escape desire. Hallucinations induced by severe hunger (*Prana* rituals).

The Islamic Middle Path



Refining instinct, not destroying it. Salvation is found by living within society, feeding the hungry, and fighting injustice.

Prophetic Wisdom: "A Muslim who associates with people and endures their harm is better than a Muslim who does not..."

Glad Tidings: Vedic Prophecies of a Final Messenger



The Context

Just as the Torah foretold a prophet to remove heavy shackles (Shiloh), Hindu scriptures foretold a great prophet to purify sins and relieve burdens.

The Purpose

To strip away the human distortions (idols, caste, asceticism) and return humanity to pure, monotheistic worship.

The 'Kalki' Prophecy: The Purifier of Sins



Birth Date: Born on the 12th of Madhav (Matches 12th of Rabi' al-Awwal).



Birthplace: The village of Sambhala, meaning "The Secure City" (Matches Makkah).



Parents: Father 'Washnuyash' (Servant of Allah) and mother 'Sumati' (Secure).



Attributes: Rides a white horse, fights for justice with the help of 'four companions' (Abu Bakr, Umar, Uthman, Ali).

“Narashans’: The Praised One

The Name

‘Narashans’ directly translates to ‘One of much praise’ (Matching the names Muhammad and Ahmad).

The Lifestyle

The text notes he would ride camels, distinguishing him from Brahma Hindus (who prohibit camels), and indicating he comes before modern transport.

The Ascension

“He would touch the heaven with his mount and then go down” (Perfectly describing the night journey of Al-Isra’ and Al-Mi’raj).

The Destruction of Caste



Islam recognizes no caste, untouchables, or divine hierarchy of birth. Value is based solely on piety and good deeds.

Quranic Truth (Surat al-Hujurat 49:13)



"Indeed, the most noble of you before Allah is the most righteous among you."

Prophetic Wisdom



"There is no superiority for an Arab over a non-Arab, nor for a white person over a black one... except in terms of piety."
